- Dramatic Reading K-12 fluency strategies and implementation nationwide.
- Planned and implemented the Milwaukee Youth Arts Center/MPS Summer Camp for talented urban children unable to afford MYAC programming.

Finally it augments University Major training with theatrical skills that will be of practical value in any professional circumstance. Currently utilized at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and Southern Methodist University.
- Skinner IPA sound change form for dialect analysis. Currently used nationally.
- Two week ten session unit teaching children the complete process of production from page to stage as it engages creative writing, oral communication proficiencies, and collaboration. This unit was invited for presentation at the International Network Arts in Educator conference in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, fall 2004.
- Rising Above A one month 5th grade thematic unit integrating history, poetry, math, reading, and drama. This unit utilized American history from 1865-1965, a period that gave Americans "true grit". The individual goals for the students were to analyze what made Americans of all nationalities "rise above" their independent perils, wants, and

needs to make a better world. Activities included reading *Number the Stars* and *Children of the Dust*, journal writing that became published poetry, recording and graphing individual and group behaviors, an in depth study of the holocaust and the dust bowl, performing scenes from a script of *Number the Stars* as a service to the Jewish Community Center, and a final public poetry reading for staff and parents highlighting their discoveries.
